An Irish Pub, a Parade, and a Paper

On a March morning in 1990, 6 guys wandered into Cavanaugh's Irish Pub in Blue Point at an ungodly hour. Chris Cavanaugh, just unlocking the bar at the time, was surprised when it came out that the group of early risers was stopping in on their way to the Westhampton St. Patrick's Day parade. Well hell, Chris thought watching them leave, why don't we have one of those?

The very next March, the first annual Bayport-Blue Point St. Patrick's Day Parade, thrown together by a young and ambitious Chamber of Commerce, kicked off, marching through both towns and concluding at Cavanaugh's Pub. It's said that that first year was little more than a bagpiper, a firetruck, and some girl scouts with a wagon. What was lacked in experience was made up for in enthusiasm, but really how were we to know that someone was going to have to pay for all those Pipe Bands?!

If we meant to continue, and we did, we needed the means to finance all those grand ideas. Tom Reid, already a printer by trade, suggested we print ourselves a paper with paid advertisements. Back then, what would become the Irish Gazette, was little more than a three-page fold-out. Local

One Moment, written and directed by local indie filmmaker Deirdre O'Connor, made its long-anticipated world debut at the Fifteenth Annual Beaufort International Film Festival on Wednesda



night to great acclaim. Shot in the streets of picturesque Blue Point in the long summer days of 2019, One

summer days of 2019, One Moment is the heartfelt story of 4 adult siblings grappling with raising their own children while they attempt to care for their recently widowed aging father.

Deirdre O'Connor skillfully draws from her Long Island roots, growing up in a large Irish Catholic household, to weave a family dynamic as recognizable to anyone here as the background shots of Corey

O'Connor literally invites you into her home (much of the filming was done at her own house) as she tackles the complexity around aging in a world where we bear children later and live longer, with a wealth of levity that has been conspicuously absent from much of 2020 yet sorely needed. It's that warmth and humor, layered into the dialog and brought to light by One Moment's delightful cast, that so successfully resounds with audiences.

Starring legendary veteran actor Danny Aiello, of Moonstruck fame, as Joe Mc-Guinness alongside Adria Tennor and Frankie Ingrassia as Joe's grown daughters, who's time together pack a charismatic punch. Audiences are also introduced to 2016 BBP graduate Sasha Georgette and BBPHS Junior Andrew Brooks, in their breakout roles.



Danny Aiello tragically passed away the winter after filming completed, leaving behind a cast and crew forever altered by their experience with the star, and making One Moment the final feature film of his long and storied career. "It was as if he really was my grandfather, always rooting me on and telling me how great I did," explained Sasha Georgette, who played Joe's granddaughter Maddie in the film, "he was an amazing actor, but he was also an amazing human and that time with him I'll hold onto for the rest of my life." Aiello was posthumously awarded Best Actor for his performance, where O'Connor accepted the honor on behalf of the Aiello family. As the curtain closed in South Carolina on the annual

film festival, Deirdre O'Connor and fellow producer Jodi Weiner packed up and started home for Blue Point, bringing the award for Best Comedy with them.



she creates. "I have all her recipes, and every time I take them out it's a trip down memory lane." Her creations are as delicious as they are beautiful. Ordering was easy, finishing the cake was even easier. We were fortunate that brilliant local Sayville photographer Belinda Randolph Mill was on hand to take these gorgeous shots before there was nothing but crumbs left. On most weekends you can find Barney's granddaughter Brittany manning the tasting room with an easy smile and an infectious laugh. The Loughlin women as a whole are a vibrant and gracious bunch,



known for their Irish hospitality. Perfect for the spring days ahead is their Pinky Rosé, a Provençal styled dry rosé named after the vineyards resident donkey who used to freely roam the property years ago. Stop in for a glass, or take home a bottle. Whether you come for the wine, you will almost certainly return for the companionship.



George Mitchell: A Remembrance

While it would be impossible for me to summarize the 94 years of my friend George Mitchell's life in this short space, everyone who knew him would agree that he was both a role model and a Gentlemen's Gentleman. He was a proud WWII Veteran, a Bayport Aerodrome Society Founder, a Sayville Yacht Club member and a proud Congregant of the Bayport Methodist Church. A spiritual man, George taught bible study and was an avid horologist (clock maker). A pilot and aviation enthusiast, George was a member of both the Long Island Early Fliers and the Antique Airplane Club of Greater NY. And where I got to know him best, George was a Charter member of the Bayport Civic Association the recipient of the 1st Annual BCA



Civic Pride Award and a mentor to me throughout.

Legend has it that George piloted a plane before ever driving a car. He spoke calmly of an emergency landing of his newly bought plane in the Long Island Sound and swimming to safety. Or the time he was hopelessly trapped above cloud cover, running out of gas and had to put his plane into a spin, descending through the clouds in hopes of finding a safe landing below. George always put his fate in the hands of the Lord and it served him well all through his days. George's aviation exploits took him all the way to the moon, where as a Grumman engineer he worked on the Apollo 11 lunar excursion module (LEM)!

George's love of flight dated back in the mid 1940's. He married his wife of some sixty years, the late Rigmor (Re), and initially settled in East Patchogue. After winning a Scholarship in Physics to Adelphi College, they moved to Carle Place and began raising their three children, John, Kirsten and Paul. Soon after graduating, in 1960 George decided he wanted to move his Family back east, and sold his wife on a beautiful little town called Bayport. While Re initially thought of Bayport as a nice place, she couldn't quite figure out George's insistence on living there. However, she would shortly learn George's little secret, that Bayport had its own Airport! Through the years, George enjoyed his flying and all that Bayport had to offer. Then in the mid 70's word was out that the Edwards Family wished to sell the airport, and developers were interested in the property. George and his fellow pilots sprung into action forming the Bayport Aerodrome Society whose mission was to preserve and protect early-20th century aviation at a representative turf airport, in an effort to save this jewel. By 1977, the Aerodrome Society succeeded in persuading the town of Islip to

Fast forward then to 2002 when the rumors again started that the Aerodrome might be sold to developers. That's when the surrounding neighbors like myself, my wife Janet, Sue Lauper, Rich Wyeroski and Bob and Mary Smith began to meet to discuss ways to once again save our Aerodrome. I had known George through his son Paul who I went to high school with and later as a fellow member of the SYC, but it was his connection with Aerodrome Society that led us to reach out to him for his help. By the time we held our first meeting at the BBP Library in 2003, George had enlisted several Aerodrome Pilots to attend and lend their support. Pilots like Gene Leavy and Harry Gunther would become longstanding members of the BCA. George Chaired "The Preservation of the Aerodrome Committee", our number one Agenda item since day one and still is. Needless to say, we were victorious in saving the Aerodrome once

buy the airport and keep it in its existing form, with a special thanks to then Supervisor



again and have since added another layer of protection by gaining National Registry of Historic Places status in 2008 The hope is that we'll always have this Crown Jewel to cherish, but that is due in no small part to the efforts of George Mitchell.

surrounding mosquitos, thus preventing the mosquitos from eating the library patrons while they enjoy the benches on the gorgeous new library grounds.



Winter Sports Wrap Up



Hello readers,

What do you do when you open your computers browser wanting to check your email or surf the web and the page displays page can't be found or something similar, in a nutshell you can't reach the internet? The first thing is to check for outages in the area. If you're not reaching the internet call Optimum at 631-348-6700 to find out if there are any outages in your area. Next step you do is the obvious, make sure everything is plugged in and all

connections are tight. Assuming this is all ok which most probably it is the final thing to do is reboot your equipment. Follow these few steps and most probably you'll be up and running.

Most people rent their modems from Optimum at approximately \$10-\$12 per month. You can purchase a modem online and save the monthly fee. They are approximately \$100. If you're eligible hopefully you have received your vaccination or at least have it scheduled and that we all continue to do our part by wearing our masks, socially distancing, and limiting ourselves to small groups. I have added Smart Home Speakers such as Alexa and Google Home to my list of services from setup to automating your home. I can install your new equipment and can show you how to use them. 

Walter Found More Cool Birds

Winter can be bit slow for those who prefer their birds in trees or at feeders, as many of our favorite and most colorful feathered friends make the migration south. However, it is still possible to see a variety of birds who summer in Canada and even in the arctic but winter on Long Island's ponds, lakes, bays and tidal creeks. In addition to our most common duck, the Mallard, our waters play host to wigeons, ring-necked ducks, shovelers, pintails, scaups, loons and mergansers. Seen here are two males and a female Hooded Merganser. Like all mergansers, the Hooded Merganser is a diving duck that feeds mainly on fish and crustaceans. They have serrated bills that help capture and hold their prey. The males have a white crest that can be opened and closed like an old-time folding fan. When lowered, it looks like a white bar behind their eyes; when raised, it looks as if the back half of the head is white. Some Hooded Mergansers may stay here to breed. However they nest I tree cavities, so during the spring and summer they will more likely to be founded upstream in wooded creeks.




